**Operating notes:**

- Participants to be supervised 1:30 with an additional adult when erecting pop up tents and using mallets
- No participants will erect the air marquees or event shelters, only erected by leaders
- Tents and marquess erected to manufacturer’s instructions

**Risk – Benefit Statement:** There is a very low risk of bumps, cuts and grazes in erecting tents, but high levels of participation, making the risk acceptable.

Tent poles breaking or defective - equipment causing minor bumps, cuts and grazes	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Check the condition of the pitching area and equipment before you begin using it, and report defects that arise during erection</li> <li>• Where possible leaders will place tent bags in pitch position to limit carrying</li> <li>• When heavy objects must be moved (air tent), appropriate manual handling techniques must be used and more than one person</li> </ul>	Very Low
Manual Handling Injury – Muscle strain from moving tents around site	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leader explains ventilation points on tents and leave doors open during good hot weather</li> <li>• In the marquee open both doors to allow airflow ventilation</li> </ul>	Very Low
Overheating – from exposure to high sun temperatures	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leader explains no running rules around tents</li> <li>• Leader explains no walking areas around tents</li> </ul>	Very Low
Tripping over tent guy ropes – bumps, cuts and grazes	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leader explains no running rules around tents</li> <li>• Leader explains no walking areas around tents</li> </ul>	Very Low
